

EOGH article submission guidelines (2026)

- Write a minimum of 500 words (for written articles) and a maximum of 3000 words. Your piece can be academic in nature, but should be understandable to non-experts (e.g. explain technical or specialized terms and abbreviations). You are also welcome to submit more creative or personal pieces, for example about your research or volunteer experience, but please cite your sources where appropriate.
- Include a minimum of **2 images**; indicate which one is to be used as the featured image. Add all images both in the text to show the desired formatting and additionally send them as jpeg/png files. It is much preferred if you can use photography or art, and it helps the overall image of the article on the website and social media. Our editing team will be happy to advise and help you pick something that suits the article. However, you may use stock images if absolutely necessary. Please make sure all images are appropriately credited (if not free to use) with the creator's name or the source - e.g. [Image: source, year].
- **References** will be formatted as links on WordPress. When writing, use Vancouver with the in-text citation just after the word you would like the hyperlink attached to (for example "as defined by the UN (1)"; see also recent published articles). When linking to a book use Google Books or similar. You can also add the reference links as in-text comments.
- Specify whether you would like your name to be linked to your LinkedIn, or other social media and add a link to your account if so.
- Write a **short blurb** (around 2-3 sentences) as a teaser/introduction to your article. A quote from your article is fine! This will show in the main blog page and the social media posts we will share on Instagram and LinkedIn. We are happy to help with this as well!
- After you send us your first draft, the editorial team will review it and suggest **edits**. We will get back to you as soon as possible. After that, you will have a few days to review our suggestions and make changes accordingly, and we will be happy to discuss any of those. We might repeat this process once or twice more, until your article is ready to be published.
- The editing team is happy to help with any inquiries and can review early drafts if required. Please do keep us up to date on any delays or if you need to extend your deadline; the more notice we have, the easier it is to rearrange the publication schedule.
- *Most importantly... have fun writing!*
